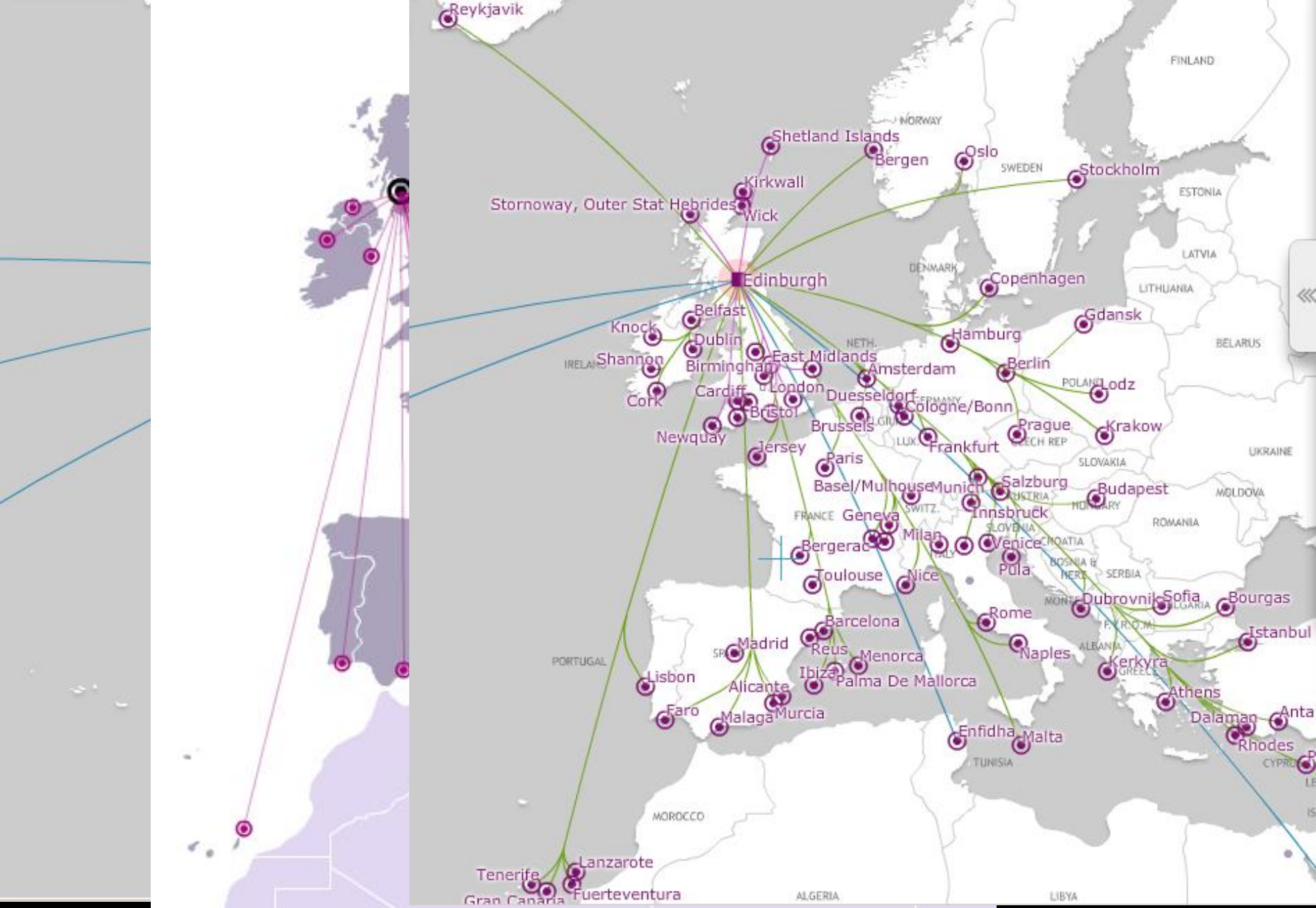

GLASGOW

Glasgow is one of Europe's most exciting destinations, which combines the energy and sophistication of a great international city with some of Scotland's most spectacular scenery.

Glasgow is home to more than 20 world class museums and art galleries. The city's impressive portfolio includes the internationally renowned Kelvingrove Art Gallery & Museum - Scotland's most visited tourist attraction. With its eclectically arranged, eye-catching exhibits, Kelvingrove Art Gallery & Museum remains one of the largest and most popular museums in the UK. The city's famous Burrell Collection is also not to be missed and the Hunterian, attached to the 15th century University of Glasgow, is the oldest public museum in Scotland.

Barcelona has Gaudi, Chicago has Frank Lloyd Wright - Glasgow has the Art Nouveau magic of Charles Rennie Mackintosh. His innovative and influential style can be seen throughout the city, and includes The Glasgow School of Art.

The city's unique style is stamped on its year-round events programme, which offers live performances, festivals and

entertainment fifty-two weeks of the year and the recent designation as a UNESCO City of Music, has firmly set the seal on Glasgow's reputation as one of Europe's premier cultural capitals. In 2014, Glasgow not only hosts the European Public Health Conference but also the Commonwealth games.

Glasgow is easy to get to, with three international airports (Glasgow Airport, Edinburgh Airport and Prestwick Airport) offering direct access from over 100 destinations. The closest airport, Glasgow Airport, is just 15 minutes from the city centre. The city also offers an outstanding choice of accommodation, all within easy reach of conference venues, shopping, restaurants and attractions.
