PLENARY: BRIDGING TOWARDS THE FUTURE OF PUBLIC HEALTH IN EUROPE: HOW TO ENSURE HEALTH IN ALL EU POLICIES?

Plenary session – Friday 22 November, 13:40-14:40

The plenary will debate on the role of the EU and its institutions in ensuring that health is addressed in all EU policies. The EU is firmly committed to implementing the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals through its range of institutional mechanisms. Incoming Commission President *von der Leyen* has pledged to refocus the European Semester 'to make sure we stay on track with our SDGs'. These developments, together with the broad recognition of the central role of health in the SDGs, presents a unique window of opportunity to critically reappraise the role of health in the EU.
